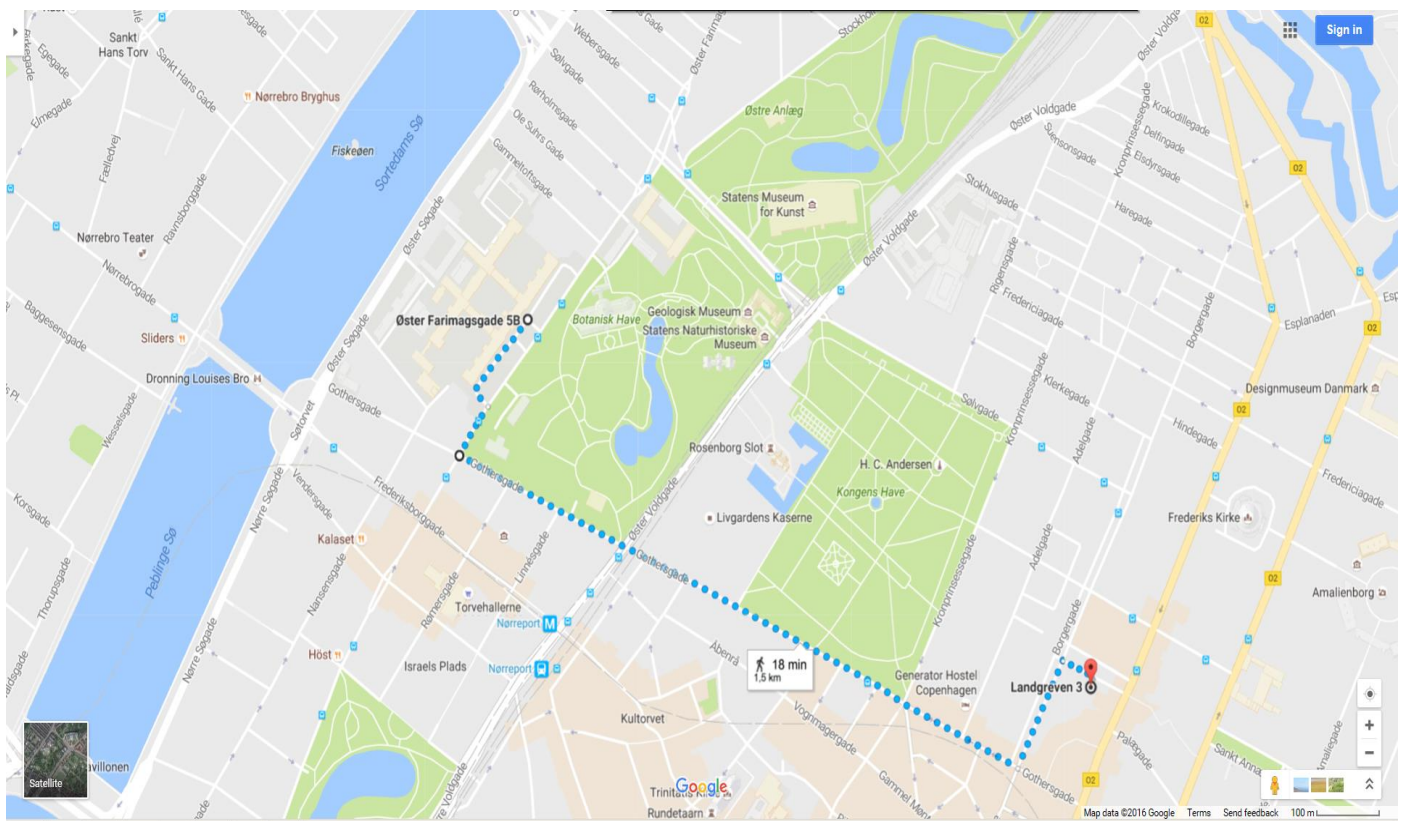
Directions and transport
