Professor Emerita Marjatta Hietala, University of Tampere, Finland: Finland's roll i den nordiska familjen. Samarbete i historieforskning

Marjatta Hietala has done her main research work in the fields of urban history, the history of innovations and the history of ideas. Perhaps the best known among her books are *"Mongoleja vai germaaneja. Rotuteorioiden suomalaiset"* (*Mongols or Germans. The Finns in the light of Race Theories*, 1985, written together with Aira Kemiläinen) and *"Services and Urbanization at the Turn of the Century. The diffusion of Innovations"* (1987). Professor Hietala has had a remarkable career in science policy in Finland and abroad. She was appointed President of the International Committee of Historical Sciences (ICHS) in 2010, and was awarded a doctorate *honoris causa* by the University of Stockholm in 2012.

Professor Thomas Hylland Eriksen, University of Oslo, Norway: Cultural complexity in the Nordic countries: Conflict, symbiosis and grammars of border-making.

Professor Thomas Hylland Eriksen's fields of research in social anthropology include identity, nationalism, globalization and identity politics. His book *"Small Places -- Large Issues"* (1995) is used in university courses in many countries and has been widely translated, as has his major textbook *"Ethnicity and Nationalism: Anthropological Perspectives"* (1993). His other major works include *"Tyranny of the Moment: Fast and Slow Time in the Information Age"* (2001) and *"Globalization: The Key Concepts"* (2007).
